Ouch no, no...Skier and Snowboarder Safety Reminder



I encourage everyone to pay attention to the club's directives on safety. The club's rules say for the safety of the group, members must participate only in activities that are well within their current physical capabilities, endurance, and skills. Otherwise, it can endanger and inconvenience the group. Also a few tips on staying safe on the slopes. There have been a few people in our club who have been hit by other skiers or snowboarders. I have had some near misses. I encourage everyone to be very vigilant about who is around them. I recommend when you stop on the slope, stay as far to the side as possible and stay visible from above. If you see snowboarders or other skiers approaching, I recommend letting them go ahead of you. If I get near another person on the slopes I call out "on your left" or "on your right" and I encourage others to do likewise. Keep in mind that a lot of people have been smoking marijuana, are listening to headphones, and are oblivious to others on the slopes. Also, supposedly everyone has read the skiers safety and responsibility act, but a lot of people don't pay attention to it and don't practice safe snow sports habits. Ski defensively!

WINTER Skiing in CRESTED BUTTE January 17-20, 2023



THIS TRIP IS FULL EXCEPT FOR 2 OPENINGS FOR SINGLE OCCUPANCY QUEEN ROOMS (\$435). WE ARE ACCEPTING NAMES FOR THE WAIT LIST – PLEASE EMAIL THE TRIP COORDINATORS. NO PAYMENT IS REQUIRED TO JOIN THE WAITLIST.

Skier's Paradise! If you are looking to cross country ski this winter, Crested Butte is the place for you, with over 50 miles of groomed trails in town and many others in the vicinity. For downhill skiers, Crested Butte Mountain Resort (Mount Crested Butte) specializes in intermediate terrain with plentiful expert and easy runs.

We will be staying in **Crested Butte town at the Cristiana Guesthaus for 3 nights January 17, 18, & 19 (Tuesday-Thursday) checking out Friday AM on the 20th.** The trip cost includes breakfast. The Cristiana provides yogurt parfait with homemade Cristiana granola, homemade muffins, breakfast breads or croissants, hard-boiled eggs, oatmeal, fruit, juices (including fresh squeezed orange juice), and beverages. Lunches are brownbag items brought from home or restaurants slope side/in town, and dinners are on your own at local restaurants. No XC trail passes or lift tickets are included in the trip cost. The Nordic Center day pass is reduced for ages 65-69 and free for over 70. For downhillers, the Epic Pass includes Mt. Crested Butte.

The trip cost has two rates. King and Queen plus Double rooms are double occupancy at \$320.00 per person. Single persons wishing to occupy a Queen room alone will pay the single occupancy rate at \$435.00. Each of the two persons in the Queen plus Double occupancy rooms will have her/his own bed and must arrange to room with someone they are comfortable with. Please identify who that is in your sign-up. The trip coordinators will not find or assign roommates but will identify other singles seeking a roommate for you to contact.

Your **non-refundable** \$50.00 deposit per person is due with the signup. Final payment is due on December 1st. Please make checks payable to Flatirons Ski Club and send them to Linda and Chris Paris at their home address (see FSC directory). Please call or e-mail Linda and Chris with questions.

Steamboat I Trip January 23-26, 2023

By the time you are reading this, Steamboat will have opened for the season (11/23), and surely some of you have already been out on your skis and getting your legs ready for the slopes. The \$200 balance of the \$285 per person cost for three nights at the Holiday Inn Steamboat Springs is due December 1. Please make the checks out to the Flatirons Ski Club (FSC) and mail them to me – Tom Cannon.

I think everyone who went on the trip last year was happy with the accommodations. The rooms are comfortable and have thermostats, so you can adjust your desired temperature. The Holiday Inn has indoor and outdoor hot tubs, a pool, and a fitness center. We don't have slope side ski in - ski out, but out the front door express shuttle service to the gondola comes pretty close! We will have use of the Champagne Room for our nightly happy hour gatherings. Drinks are available from the full-service bar and discounted during their happy hours. Outside liquor is not permitted, though some members have been known to fill their Contigos with something other than Arnold Palmers. The Holiday Inn provides discount coupons for breakfast at their Rex's American Grill. They also serve lunch and dinner. All the rooms have microwaves if you want to make your own oatmeal or cook eggs. One member heats up his jumbo breakfast burrito.

In addition to world class skiing, and their legendary champagne powder, Steamboat has miles of cross-country skiing and snowshoeing to explore. The town of Steamboat has many choices for restaurants and there are enough stores to keep serious shoppers happy. You are welcome to join the trip and not ski, just relax. You can take the shuttle bus to town and enjoy the hot springs. There are still openings, so sign up, if you haven't or invite a friend. See you in Steamboat, if not before.

Do be prepared for winter driving - going over Rabbit Ears Pass can be treacherous in white out conditions. Snow tires are highly recommended, along with a full tank of gas, extra food and warm clothes.

Monarch Mountain & Wolf Creek Jan. 31 - Feb. 3, 2023

Please join us for our second combined Flatirons Ski Club trip to Wolf Creek and Monarch Mountain. This year we will have a three-night stay at The Baymont by Wyndham in Salida and you can travel to the ski area of your choice, Monarch Mountain or Wolf Creek. The drive to Wolf Creek Ski area from our hotel is two hours, mostly on an easy stretch of Highway 285, while the drive to Monarch is 30 minutes mostly up Monarch Pass. We are hopeful that both areas will have great snow this year, but we can opt for either one depending upon conditions.

Our stay at The Baymont hotel will include:

- Spacious rooms with two comfortable queen beds;
- Continental breakfast + (with scrambled eggs);
- Room amenities include big-screen TV, desk/chair, mini-fridge, micro-wave, coffee/tea maker, hair dryers, ironing board;
- Indoor swimming pool and hot tub; and
- Business center and laundry facilities.

Total cost per person for all three nights (double room occupancy) is \$215. Deposit is \$40. Please send all deposit and balance checks to Louise Geil.

Snow Mountain Ranch in Fraser is a wonderful location for cross country skiing with miles of groomed trails. Snow Mountain Ranch offers snowshoeing, swimming, roller skating, arts & crafts, cross country skiing, and many other activities.

Downhill skiing is located nearby at Winter Park, Mary Jane, and Granby Ranch. Cross country skiing also is available at Devil's Thumb and other sites nearby to Snow Mountain Ranch.

The accommodations include two reunion cabins with seven bedrooms. The trip fee includes use of most of the YMCA facilities, meals, and lodging. Trip attendees prepare the group meals at the cabins, and food is available to take for lunch. The trip fee includes SMR trail pass, meals, and lodging.

If the two cabins are full and additional members want to join this trip, it may be possible to reserve lodge rooms for the overflow.

Snowy Range 2023 February 14-16 (2 Nights)

Snowy Range Ski Area is beautifully nestled within the scenic Medicine Bow National Forest in southeast Wyoming. There's downhill skiing as well as many trails for cross country skiing. It's an easy drive with no mountain passes or tunnels to navigate and it's only about 2 1/2 hours from Boulder!

We will stay at the rustic and charming Old Corral Hotel which is in Centennial WY (2750 Hwy 130). The Old Corral Hotel is only 4 miles away from the ski area, which is really convenient. The trip fee of \$130 per person is based on double occupancy, and it includes 2 queen size beds, with mini fridge (microwaves in common area). The Hotel is within a 5-minute walk to Mountain View Café or Bear Bottom Bar and Grill which is very handy for dinner or breakfast. The Steakhouse, adjacent the Hotel, will likely be open for Valentine's Day dinner as well.

There are usually few people skiing mid-week at Snowy Range and I must say it's a nice change of pace. Another really great thing is that the price of a day ticket (18-69yrs) is only \$49 and everyone 70+ is free! So please join us as we ski Snowy Range Ski Area, Wyoming, 2023.

BOOK: Fooled by Randomness
By Nassim Nicolas Taleb

This book is about luck—or more precisely, about how we perceive and deal with luck in life and business. Set against the backdrop of the most conspicuous forum in which luck is mistaken for skill—the world of trading—Fooled by Randomness provides captivating insight into one of the least understood factors in all our lives. Writing in an entertaining narrative style, the author tackles major intellectual issues related to the underestimation of the influence of happenstance on our lives.

The book is populated with an array of characters, some of whom have grasped, in their own way, the significance of chance: the baseball legend Yogi Berra; the philosopher of knowledge Karl Popper; the ancient world's wisest man, Solon; the modern financier George Soros; and the Greek voyager Odysseus. We also meet the fictional Nero, who seems to understand the role of randomness in his professional life but falls victim to his own superstitious foolishness.

However, the most recognizable character of all remains unnamed—the lucky fool who happens to be in the right place at the right time—he embodies the “survival of the least fit.” Such individuals attract devoted followers who believe in their guru's insights and methods. But no one can replicate what is obtained by chance.

Are we capable of distinguishing the fortunate charlatan from the genuine visionary? Must we always try to uncover nonexistent messages in random events? It may be impossible to guard ourselves against the vagaries of the goddess Fortuna, but after reading Fooled by Randomness we can be a little better prepared.

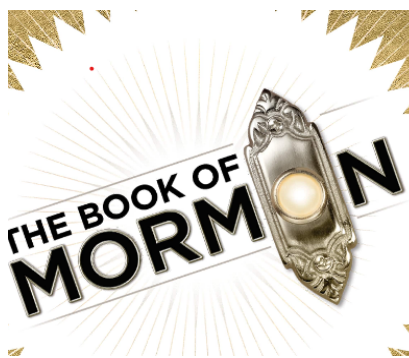
