## October 2022: Protocol for Ski Trip Sign-Ups

Please read this document in its entirety as there are important changes in this year's sign-up protocol!

This October newsletter has detailed write-ups on all the ski trips, and the ski calendar summarizes the important details. In addition, those trip coordinators who attend the October general meeting will be asked to present each of their trips.

Signing up for a ski trip involves completing a sign-up form and writing a check **made out to the Flatirons Ski Club** for **each** trip that you would like to attend. For example, if you want to sign up for 4 trips, you will need to complete 4 sign-up forms and write 4 checks.

If you attend the October meeting, you can bring completed sign-up forms and checks to the meeting. If you do not attend the October meeting or prefer not to sign up there, you can send your completed sign-up forms and checks to the trip coordinators within the next couple of days. You can find their mailing addresses on the latest roster. **Remember:** checks should be made out to the Flatirons Ski Club, not to the trip coordinators.

Often these trips are oversubscribed. So that everyone has an equal chance of getting a spot on the trips, I am requesting that trip coordinators wait until October 12<sup>th</sup> before processing the forms and checks, rather than giving priority to those who handed their forms/checks in at the meeting or were lucky enough to have their mail arrive before October 12<sup>th</sup>.

If there are more applications than spots, then at their discretion, trip coordinators can add rooms, if possible, to accommodate everyone who has applied. If not everyone can be accommodated, trip coordinators will use a lottery system to determine who is accepted and who is put on the waitlist.

If you **want** to be on the waitlist, please indicate that clearly on your sign-up form.

I hope you find this to be a fair process!

### Important notes:

- You need to be an active FSC member to sign up for ski trips.
- You need to sign a waiver and return it to Linda Giandinoto at least two weeks before your trip.
- **Monies paid for a ski trip (including both deposits and balances) are generally non-refundable.** If you must cancel, notify the trip coordinator promptly so a replacement can be found. The replacing person directly reimburses the person who is canceling. If a replacement cannot be found, your payment is non-refundable.
- The current COVID protocol regarding attending overnight ski trips states that all attendees must be vaccinated. This protocol will be further clarified as soon as possible and will be announced via email (and in future newsletters). Note that the policy may change over time due to COVID trends and hotspots.

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## WINTER Skiing in CRESTED BUTTE January 17-20, 2023



Skier's Paradise! If you are looking to cross country ski this winter, Crested Butte is the place for you, with over 50 miles of groomed trails in town and many others in the vicinity. For downhill skiers, Crested Butte Mountain Resort (Mount Crested Butte) specializes in intermediate terrain with plentiful expert and easy runs.

We will be staying in **Crested Butte town at the Cristiana Guesthaus for 3 nights January 17, 18, & 19 (Tuesday-Thursday) checking out Friday AM on the 20th.** The trip cost includes breakfast. The Cristiana provides yogurt parfait with homemade Cristiana granola, homemade muffins, breakfast breads or croissants, hard-boiled eggs, oatmeal, fruit, juices (including fresh squeezed orange juice), and beverages. Lunches are brownbag items brought from home or restaurants slope side/in town, and dinners are on your own at local restaurants. No XC trail passes or lift tickets are included in the trip cost. The Nordic Center day pass is reduced for ages 65-69 and free for over 70. For downhillers, the Epic Pass includes Mt. Crested Butte. If you are concerned about possible COVID conditions by the trip date, put yourself on the waiting list (no deposit is required to join the list). You must be vaccinated and willing to abide by all COVID regulations in force to come on this trip.

**The trip cost has two rates.** King and Queen plus Double rooms are double occupancy at \$320.00 per person. Single persons wishing to occupy a Queen room alone will pay the single occupancy rate at \$435.00. Each of the two persons in the Queen plus Double occupancy rooms will have her/his own bed and must arrange to room with someone they are comfortable with. Please identify who that is in your sign-up. The trip coordinators will not find or assign roommates but will identify other singles seeking a roommate for you to contact.

Your **non-refundable** \$50.00 deposit per person is due within one week after the October 5th FSC meeting. Pay at the meeting or send your check by mail directly to the trip coordinators. Final payment is due on December 1st. Please make checks payable to Flatirons Ski Club and send them to Linda and Chris Paris at their home address (see FSC directory). **Write 2023 Winter Crested Butte in the memo line.** Do not send checks for this trip to the FSC P.O. ## **Steamboat #1 January 23-26, 2023**

The club will be staying at the Holiday Inn Steamboat Springs - Monday 1/23/23, Tuesday 1/24/23, and Wednesday 1/25/23 (three nights), checking out on Thursday 1/26/23. The Holiday Inn was very popular with everyone last year because of the wonderful service and the great amenities, including their own direct shuttle service to the mountain. The service is fast and eliminates walking on icy sidewalks and waiting for the town shuttle. No other club ski trip will be staying this close to a ski area or has this convenience - none. The Aspen trip involves driving an hour (without weather or traffic issues to get to the lifts).

The Holiday Inn has their own restaurant and bar, which proved to be popular. Last year we were able to use their Champagne Room for our nightly happy hour get-togethers. It will be available to us again this year. The Holiday Inn has indoor and outdoor hot tubs, a pool, and a fitness center. The per person cost for three nights in a room with double occupancy is \$285. For those wanting a single, the price is \$570. Downtown Steamboat offers many different restaurants and shopping opportunities and is accessible from the Holiday Inn via town shuttle or a ten-minute drive by car.

Steamboat is of course one of the premier mountains in the state and offers runs for all abilities. There are many fun blue and green cruising runs for beginners and intermediates, and challenging bumps and incomparable tree skiing for advanced skiing. If we get to experience their champagne powder, we'll have memories for a lifetime!

Getting to Steamboat involves driving over Rabbit Ears Pass. Be prepared for icy and snow packed conditions! Snow tires are recommended as well as traveling with extra food and clothing and a tank full of gas!

Looking forward to sharing this trip with fifty Flatirons Ski Club members.

## **Monarch Mountain & Wolf Creek Jan. 31 - Feb. 3, 2023**

Please join us for our second combined Flatirons Ski Club trip to Wolf Creek and Monarch Mountain. This year we will have a three-night stay at The Baymont by Wyndham in Salida and you can travel to the ski area of your choice, Monarch Mountain or Wolf Creek. The drive to Wolf Creek Ski area from our hotel is two hours, mostly on an easy stretch of Highway 285, while the drive to Monarch is 30 minutes mostly up Monarch Pass. We are hopeful that both areas will have great snow this year, but we can opt for either one depending upon conditions.

### **Our stay at The Baymont hotel will include:**

- Spacious rooms with two comfortable queen beds;
- Continental breakfast + (with scrambled eggs);
- Room amenities include big-screen TV, desk/chair, mini-fridge, micro-wave, coffee/tea maker, hair dryers, ironing board;
- Indoor swimming pool and hot tub; and
- Business center and laundry facilities.

**Total cost per person for all three nights (double room occupancy) is \$215. Deposit is \$40. Please send all deposit and balance checks to Louise Geil.**

There will be a social gathering with appetizers in the breakfast area each night (Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday). Please bring your favorite appetizer to share. Paper products and non-alcoholic beverages along with some snacks will be provided. BYOB if desired.

Downhill skiing is located nearby at Winter Park, Mary Jane, and Granby Ranch. Cross country skiing also is available at Devil's Thumb and other sites nearby to Snow Mountain Ranch.

The accommodations include two reunion cabins with seven bedrooms. The trip fee includes use of most of the YMCA facilities, meals, and lodging. Trip attendees prepare the group meals at the cabins, and food is available to take for lunch. The trip fee includes SMR trail pass, meals, and lodging.

## **Snowy Range 2023 February 14-16 (2 Nights)**

Snowy Range Ski Area is beautifully nestled within the scenic Medicine Bow National Forest in southeast Wyoming. There's downhill skiing as well as many trails for cross country skiing as well. It's an easy drive with no mountain passes or tunnels to navigate and it's only about 2 1/2 hours from Boulder!

We will stay at the rustic and charming Old Corral Hotel which is in Centennial WY (2750 Hwy 130). The Old Corral Hotel is only 4 miles away from the ski area, which is really convenient. The trip fee of \$130 per person is based on double occupancy, and it includes 2 queen size beds, with mini fridge (microwaves in common area). The Hotel is within a 5-minute walk to Mountain View Café or Bear Bottom Bar and Grill which is very handy for dinner or breakfast. The Steakhouse, adjacent the Hotel, will likely be open for Valentine's Day dinner as well.

There are usually few people skiing mid-week at Snowy Range and I must say it's a nice change of pace. Another really great thing is that the price of a day ticket (18-69yrs) is only \$49 and everyone 70+ is free! So please join us as we ski Snowy Range Ski Area, Wyoming, 2023.

Most of us ski at Ski Cooper located 10 miles from Leadville vis US-24.

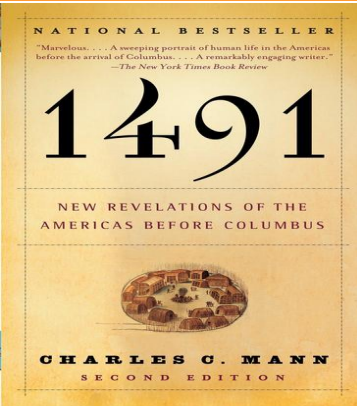
Lift ticket Prices – 75 and over are free (includes some other areas) The ticket office is presently closed so I could not get day prices, probably until end October.

**BOOK:** 1491, New Revelations of the Americas Before Columbus  
by Charles Mann

Contrary to what so many Americans learn in school, the pre-Columbian Indians were not sparsely settled in a pristine wilderness; rather, there were huge numbers of Indians who actively molded and influenced the land around them. The astonishing Aztec capital of Tenochtitlan had running water and immaculately clean streets and was larger than any contemporary European city. Mexican cultures created corn in a specialized breeding process that it has been called man's first feat of genetic engineering. Indeed, Indians were not living lightly on the land but were landscaping and manipulating their world in ways that we are only now beginning to understand. Challenging and surprising, this a transformative new look at a rich and fascinating world we only thought we knew.
